These mission offerings are collected annually and support Southern Baptist works that are nearby Asheboro, through North Carolina and America and over the world.


September – North Carolina Missions Offering: “Compelled By Christ, Proclaiming Release, Relief and Redemption”. This offering helps support North Carolina mission works including the NC Baptist Men, mission camps, associational projects and church planting. There are an estimated 5.8 million lost/un-churched people in North Carolina. There is a need for church planting and outreaching to people in need of hearing the Word.

November – Thanksgiving Offering for the Baptist Children’s Homes of North

Carolina: “Sharing Hope...Changing Lives”. On November 10th a speaker and some children from The Mills Home in Thomasville, NC will worship with us at Cedar Grove. The Christian staff there provide and a safe and stable environment for many hurting children.

December – Lottie Moon Christmas Offering: The theme for 2013 is “Totally His – Heart, Hands, Voice”. This offering is taken to support Southern Baptist missionaries serving in foreign lands and the International Mission Board. As Christians we are called to share the Great Commission given by Jesus, (Matthew 28: 18-20).

Praying is one of the first and most important things you can do as we enter this season of mission giving opportunities. Pray that God would direct you as you support these important mission works, nearby, throughout North Carolina, America and the entire world.

LET THE LOWER LIGHT BE BURNING

Philip Paul Bliss was directing the singing for a series of services being conducted by the well-known preacher Dwight L. Moody. As he closed his message, Moody told the story of a captain who was attempting to bring his boat to the Cleveland Harbour one very dark and stormy night.

“The waves rolled like mountains,” Moody said, “and not a star was to be seen in the clouded sky.” He pictured the boat rocking on the violent waves as the captain peered through the darkness for the sight of a signal light by means of which to guide his vessel to safety. When he finally spotted a single light from the light-house, he turned to the pilot and asked, “Are you sure this is Cleveland Harbour?”

“Quite sure, sir,” the pilot replied.

“Then where are the lower lights?” the captain continued.

“Gone out, sir,” the other man answered.

“Can you make the harbour?” the captain asked anxiously.

“We must, or perish, sir,” the pilot replied.

But despite his strong heart and brave hand, in the darkness he missed the channel. With a resounding crash the boat piled up on the rocks and then settled slowly to a watery grave.

As the congregation listened intently, Moody concluded with this admonition to the Christians, “Brethren, the Master will take care of the great light-house; let us keep the lower lights burning.” That was all Bliss needed to pen one of his most popular hymns, “Let the Lower Lights Be Burning.”¹

*Brightly beams our Father's mercy from His lighthouse evermore,
but to us He gives the keeping of the lights along the shore.
Dark the night of sin has settled. Loud the angry billows roar;
eager eyes are watching, longing for the lights along the shore.
Trim your feeble lamp, my brother! Some poor sailor tempest tossed,
trying now to make the harbor, in the darkness may be lost.*

Chorus:

*Let the lower lights be burning! Send a gleam across the wave!
Some poor fainting, struggling seaman you may rescue, you may save.*

And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen. (Matthew 28:18-20)

But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth. (Acts 1:8)

Note that Jesus said, *ye shall be witnesses unto me*. As a Christian, you do not choose between being a witness or not being a witness—You *are* a witness. Your only decision is which kind of witness will you be. Will you be a faithful witness or an unfaithful one?
